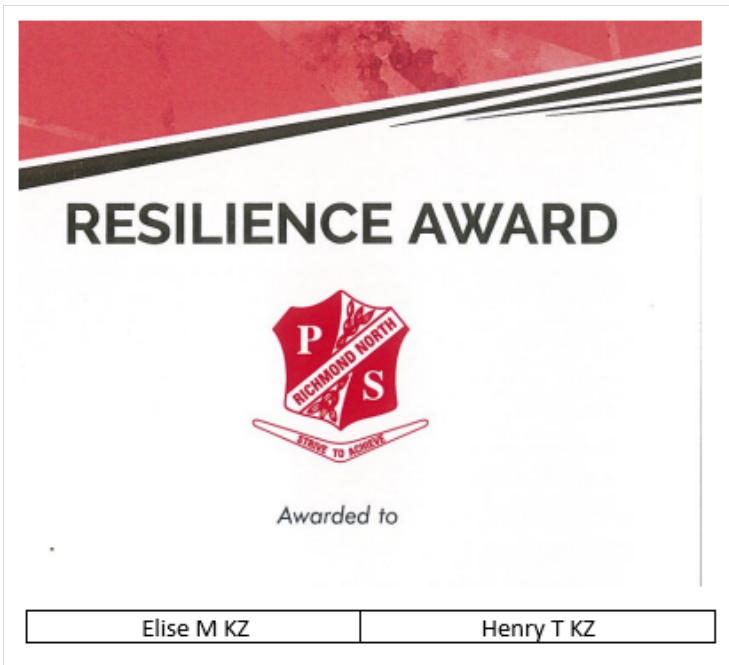

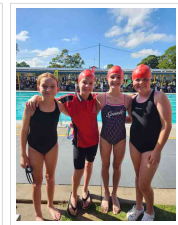
RSL and Schools Commemorate ANZAC Day

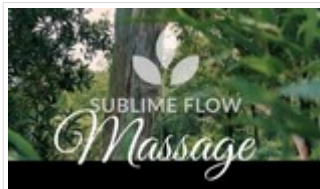
